Asked how long it took her to create the artwork for the poster, she replied, "I'm not really sure how long it took ... I kind of zone out and listen to music when I'm creating — definitely a couple days. I usually work six hours or so at a time."

Mastrangelo has a Bachelor's degree in Fine Arts from Coastal Carolina University, but said she has been drawing since she was a child.

"I recently had a joint show at Sunrise Civic Center Art Gallery and have my first solo show at Harold's Cafe in West Palm Beach in April 2019. I'm also one of the artists in the Continuum art exhibit in West Palm Beach this

month [December]. I teach acrylic art classes as well, for my company, Mobile Masterpieces," she said.

The Lantana resident said she loves going to Deerfield Beach.

"I grew up in a small, mountain town — Glens Falls, in upstate New York — but I moved out as soon as I was able to. I ended up in South Carolina for college to be near the ocean," she said.

Asked what is something interesting about her that not everyone may know, Mastrangelo replied, "Something a lot of people don't know is that I grew up originally wanting to be a marine biologist. We went to Maine every year since I was an infant

until I moved at age 18 to Wells/Ogunquit beach. I fell in love, as a kid, with the ocean and was fascinated by sea life. I loved reading the adventures of Jacques Cousteau. Since I moved to Florida, I learned to dive, and I'm advanced certified. My artwork heavily reflects my love for the sea. I'm extremely thankful to live in a tropical place where I can find multiple sources of inspiration."

Mastrangelo added that she is "really excited and looking forward to" this year's Festival of the Arts.
